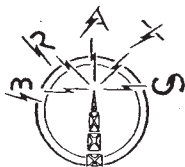
## FCC Sets New Vanity Fee Start Date: August 6, 2004

The FCC has announced that the new Amateur Radio vanity call sign regulatory fee of \$20.80 for the 10-year license term will go into effect August 6. Applicants for amateur vanity call signs will continue to pay the \$16.30 fee per vanity call sign application received by FCC until the new fee goes into effect. The FCC says it expects to collect close to \$162,000 from 7800 Amateur Radio vanity call sign applicants during Fiscal Year 2004. See the FCC's annual Report and Order (Docket MD04-73) for details on their assessment and collection of regulatory fees for FY2004.

## Hawaii's Governor Vetoes Amateur Radio Antenna Bills

Hawaii Gov Linda Lingle has vetoed two Amateur Radio antenna bills. Both pieces of legislation would have provided limited opportunities for amateurs living under private deed covenants, conditions and restrictions (CC&Rs) to erect antennas.

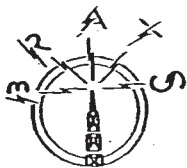

## **AMSAT-OSCAR Echo Satellite Launched!**

A Russian Dnepr LV rocket carrying the AMSAT-OSCAR Echo Amateur Radio satellite and several other payloads launched on schedule today at 0630 UTC from Baikonur Cosmodrome in Kazakhstan. AMSAT-NA says it received a telephone report from Chuck Green, N0ADI, who was at the launch site, that the launch was successful and all spacecraft had separated successfully. Ground controllers made their first contact with Echo at 1452 UTC and collected some telemetry to analyze before shutting down the digital downlink transmitter. The first downlink signals were 435.150 MHz FM at 9600 bps.

## **Echo Satellite is Officially AMSAT-OSCAR 51**

NEWINGTON, CT, --AMSAT's Bill Tynan, W3XO, issued the following statement concerning the latest amateur satellite, AMSAT-OSCAR Echo, which was launched June 29 from the Baikonur Cosmodrome in Kazakhstan. "AMSAT-NA President Robin Haighton, VE3FRH has asked me to handle issuance of OSCAR numbers, and has written me requesting an OSCAR number for the Echo satellite. Therefore, in response to his communication, I hereby issue Echo the number AMSAT-OSCAR-51 (AO-51) to this exciting new Amateur Radio spacecraft. Thus, AO-51 joins a long line of Amateur Radio satellites beginning with OSCAR-1 launched in December 1961. "I wish to congratulate everyone involved in the design, construction, testing, preparing for launch, launching and commissioning of this latest Amateur Radio spacecraft..."

## **SO-50 satellite now available to all via CTCSS tone:**

AMSAT-NA says the the SO-50 satellite also known as SaudiSat-1C now is available to all, and users can switch on the Mode J transponder via a CTCSS tone. Here's the procedure: Transmit on 145.850 MHz (taking Doppler effect into account) using a CTCSS tone of 74.4 Hz to arm the onboard 10-minute timer. Then, transmit FM voice on 145.850 MHz using a CTCSS tone of 67.0 Hz to actuate the repeater within the 10-minute window. SO-50's downlink frequency is 436.800 MHz. Sending the 74.4 Hz CTCSS tone again within the 10-minute window resets the timer. SO-50 sports a quarter-wave vertical receiving antenna mounted at the top corner of the spacecraft. The transmitter runs 250 mW into a quarter-wave antenna mounted on the bottom corner of the spacecraft and canted 45 degrees inward. (sourced to arrl letter, via WIA QNEWS))

## **AMSAT-NA debuts Web site makeover (**

AMSAT-NA introduced its new Web site design June 29 to coincide with the successful AMSAT-OSCAR Echo launch. The site has been available in "beta" form for a few weeks. "I must personally thank Emily Clarke for her excellent work in developing this new Web site," said AMSAT-NA President Robin Haighton VE3FRH. "Judging by your comments, it already has your approval." The AMSAT-NA Web site makeover has been in the works for about a year under the management of AMSAT-NA Executive Vice President Rick Hamblv. W2GPS.

## **A fluid that doesn't make things wet.**

Coming soon to fire suppression systems and fire extinguishers near you will be a fluid that doesn't make things wet. The 3M company has developed "Novec 1230", a uorinated ketone with a chemical structure of six carbon molecules that looks like water and is said to have an "ideal balance of performance, toxicological and environmental properties." Paper is not made wet by it, and "Novec 1230" can be sprayed over electrical equipment, indeed they can be immersed in it, and remain running and functional. Guess what? The computer over-clocking community has already begun thinking about whether it has good heat absorption qualities, with a view to running computers immersed in it. [WIA QNEWS]

## **Yes, we've landed; no, you can't look outside**

When Northwest 1152 from Minneapolis-St. Paul to Rapid City, S.D., landed, it was within five minutes of schedule, even though it was a couple of minutes late leaving. One look out the window by a passenger suggested a reason: Instead of the usual terminal bustle, there were barracks-like buildings and military tupes. Then he and the other 116 passengers were instructed to lower the window shades. The pilot "hemmed and he hawed and he said, 'We have landed at an Air Force base a few miles from the Rapid City airport and now we are going to figure out how we're going to get from here to there,' one passenger recounts in the St. Paul Pioneer Press. In fact, the Airbus was at Ellsworth Air Force Base, five miles and "just over the hill" from Rapid City Regional. Passengers and crew waited in the plane for three hours while military officials questioned the crew. The captain and first officer were replaced by a different crew, which flew the passengers to the regional airport, arriving 3 hours and 42 minutes later. Northwest confirmed an "unscheduled landing" but little else. "We're not acknowledging it was pilot error," said spokesman Kurt Ebenhoch. The carrier apologized and offered free round-trip tickets to the passengers. The FAA is investigating.

## **'Wrong airport' pilots grounded**

The pilot and co-pilot of that Northwest plane that landed at an Air Force base instead of Rapid City, S.D., have been suspended during the investigation, the carrier tells The Associated Press. Air Force Lt. Christine Millette said the pilots reported they were in contact with Rapid City controllers on their approach when they descended into a cloud. When the plane came out of the cloud, the first runway the pilots saw was Ellsworth—about seven miles away from the airport the plane was supposed to land at.

## **ADP Telecom Deploys Cisco Wireless Infrastructure at Roissy Charles De Gaulle Airport and Paris Expo-Porte De Versailles**

**Fench Airports Operator Targets Convention/Hospitality Sector and Other Airports with LAN Services Based on Cisco Aironet Access Point and Catalyst Switch Platforms**

PARIS—(Cisco Systems® today announced that ADP Telecom, which, as part of the French airports operator Aeroports de Paris, oversees telecommunications across all airports and landing fields within a 50 kilometer radius of Paris, is switching to Cisco® platforms for the delivery of wireless local-area-network (WLAN) services at Roissy Charles de Gaulle airport's Terminal 1. ADP Telecom is also using Cisco technology to provide WLAN services for the Paris Expo-Porte de Versailles, the second-largest convention center in Europe, to deliver wireless services to visitors and exhibitors. ADP Telecom will operate all voice, data and video services for all exhibitors and visitors of the Paris Expo Organization. The announcement follows successful ADP Telecom deployments of Cisco WLANs at many smaller airports and hotels, including 46 hotels of the Alliance Hospitality chain in France and Belgium (Holiday Inn), each with between 200 and 300 rooms.

## **Salt Lake City goes wireless**

Fliers with wireless Internet-enabled personal digital assistants and laptops can connect to the Web in all areas of Salt Lake City International Airport, including ticketing, baggage claim, restaurants, lounges and at all gate areas. Previously, Internet access options — except for a single Wi-Fi hot spot in the members-only Delta Crown Room — were essentially pay phone dial-ups. Russ Pack, administrative director for the airport, tells The Salt Lake Tribune that high-speed access "was very limited, with none in the public areas at all." With the new system "we are now ahead of a lot of big airports in providing Wi-Fi throughout the facility." Sprint's service costs \$9.95 for 24-hour "Pay-As-You-Go" access, or a monthly \$49.95.

## **Police at Logan to use wireless database**

DANVERS, Mass. (AP) — State troopers at Logan International Airport will be able to use a handheld wireless device to search a vast database of information about people they are investigating. Officials at LocatePLUS Holdings Corp. said troopers could use a Blackberry wireless device to search the company's database, which contains billions of online public records. Jon Latorella, president and chief executive of the company said the company aggregates and integrates a number of databases to create a "complete dossier" on people that investigators find useful. "It's a great response. Everywhere we've shown it, everyone wants it," he said. Latorella wouldn't say how many of the Blackberrys would be used by the State Police. State Police Lt. Thomas Coffey said the system has already been in use at the airport on a pilot basis. "It's an invaluable system. It really provides us with information that we probably could not obtain elsewhere without a lot of legwork," he said. Coffey said troopers at Logan also can use a separate wireless device that gives them access to law enforcement databases. LocatePLUS officials said other units of the State Police have already been using their database. The company says it has more than 15,000 customers, including more than 2,000 law enforcement agencies. It estimates it has information in its database on approximately 205 million people.

## **Computer to monitor pilots' alertness on 18.5-hour flight:**

Singapore Airlines (SIA) began Monday what became the world's longest non-stop flight. The flight left Singapore at 12:05 p.m. local time Monday and arrived in New York at 6 a.m. this morning. Think that's a long time for a pilot to fly? You're right. Pilots flying the non-stop route will be hooked up to a hand-held computer and have to wear a special watch to monitor their alertness levels during the 18 1/2 hour flight, The Associated Press reports. Singapore Civil Aviation officials say the tests will help determine whether new regulations are needed to cover pilots' working hours on the super-long flights.

## **Fish story grows:**

Ray Bolanos reported 40 pounds of halibut missing from his luggage after a Continental flight from Anchorage to Seattle, we noted last week. This week, a growing stench led airline officials to a luggage conveyor belt at Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport, where they discovered "a ton of rotting fish" believed to be Bolanos' missing halibut, the Associated Press reports. Brenee Davis, a general manager for Continental Airlines in Anchorage, said the airport's new baggage belt system has been in use for only a few weeks. Her theory is that Bolanos' cooler wasn't properly secured and came open on the conveyor belt. Bolanos isn't sure he buys that explanation. When his fish cooler came off the luggage carousel in Seattle, he said he found the rope he had tied around the chest inside — and his 40 individually wrapped one-pound chunks of halibut gone. When the fish was discovered in Anchorage, it smelled pretty badly and was immediately thrown away. Davis wasn't sure how many pieces of fish had been found. "We're still finding it," she said. "We've got a long bag belt system." The into the disappearing/reappearing fish continues.



## **Man charged with dropping shorts in airport security line**

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Travelers are used to removing their shoes at the airport, but one passenger took it a step further and dropped his shorts, airport police said. Police said a security screener was waving a metal-detecting wand over Daryl Miller's pants area on Friday when Miller pulled his shorts down to his ankles. He wasn't wearing any underwear. Miller then said, "There, how do you like your job," thus ending the screening, according to the police report. Airport police charged him with indecent exposure, and he was released after paying \$300 bail. We've never had anybody do that before," said airport police Lt. Matt Christenson. "But it's not abnormal for people to become frustrated with the screening process."

"This person exposed himself in a public area, a clear violation of the law, and we needed to take some action on that, otherwise everybody would be dropping their pants," Christenson said. In August 2003, the TSA said a man removed his pants during a screening at Hollywood International Airport in Florida. That man, who was wearing boxer shorts, said a security guard had ordered him to remove the pants.

## **Would you like your surgery with or without airfare?**

Package tours where customers buy airfare and hotel as a single-price unit have become increasingly popular recently. It's usually a good way for travelers to save money and for airlines and hotels to unload distressed inventory without revealing how much (or how little, rather) they're willing to sell for. But Singapore discounter Valuair has taken a novel approach on the travel packages, saying it plans to launch a series of regional tours that incorporate short vacations with outpatient surgery. The Canadian Press says that 12 customers have already paid about \$2,200 for the tours, which cover travel from Singapore to Bangkok for corrective laser eye surgery followed by a three-day "recuperation" stay at the Thai beach resort of Pattava.

## **Radio Free Syria to Broadcast on 13650 kHz**

Thursday, June 17 2004 Radio Free Syria will hit the airwaves this weekend, Clandestine Radio Watch (CRW) has learned, marking the first phase of a sophisticated media campaign to chip away at the Ba'at Party regime in Damascus and to promote democracy and tolerance. The station's inaugural broadcast will occur on June 20, 2004, and air thereafter on Sundays at 1800 UTC on 13650 kHz. [eham,net]

## **Radio 945AM to start new tests from Latvia**

The MW project in Riga on 945 kHz will commence a new series of test transmissions for two weeks starting at the end of June. The exact dates will be announced soon. The name of the station will be "Radio 945 AM", and it will be on the air 24 hours with oldies from the 50s and 60s, and with programming in Latvian and English. The power will be 2.7kW, in prime time hours up to 20 kW. Licensee of Radio 945AM is the Riga-based KREBS TV.

## **Continental expands Wi-Fi**

Continental Airlines will offer free wireless Internet access in all of its Presidents Clubs located in the USA, except for Chicago, where Continental shares space with Northwest. Continental hopes to expand the free Internet access worldwide by the end of the year.

## **FCC Says Pending 40-Meter Changes will Enhance Spectrum Efficiency**

NEWINGTON, CT, Jun 17, 2004--The FCC says pending changes in the 40-meter amateur band as a result of World Radiocommunication Conference 2003 (WRC-03) will improve spectrum efficiency. The Commission's remark came in a Notice of Proposed Rule Making (NPRM) in ET Docket 04-139, which seeks public comments on proposed rule changes to complete domestic implementation of various WRC-03 allocation decisions. The NPRM primarily affects Parts 2, 25 and 73 of the FCC's rules. "We anticipate that administrations in Regions 1 and 3 will in the near future authorize phone emissions in the segment 7150-7200 kHz," the FCC predicted in the NPRM, "and we note the ARRL has requested that the frequency segment for phone emissions be expanded to 7125-7300 kHz." The FCC said authorizing phone in the 7150-7200 kHz segment of the band would permit same-frequency US-to-DX contacts, resulting in increased spectrum efficiency. Amateurs in the Region 1 countries of Norway, Croatia and San Marino already have been granted access to 7100 to 7200 kHz on a secondary, non-interference basis. Under the present regime, most amateur stations in Regions 1 and 3 use 7075-7100 kHz for phone. Since the US phone band is 7150 to 7300 kHz, this means most US-to-DX operation requires "split" operation. The band 7000-7300 kHz is allocated to the Amateur Service on a primary, exclusive basis in Region 2, but that is not the case in much of the rest of the world. Effective next January 1, WRC-03 allocated the band 7100-7200 kHz to the Amateur Service in Regions 1 and 3 on a co-primary basis with broadcasting. After March 9, 2009, 7100-7200 kHz will be allocated to the Amateur Service on an exclusive basis throughout the world, except in some Region 1 and Region 3 countries. "As such, Amateur Service use of this 100 kilohertz will be on a de facto secondary basis in Regions 1 and 3 until the broadcasting service vacates the band 7100-7200 kHz at the conclusion of Schedule B in 2009," the FCC noted. "This means that amateur stations in Regions 1 and 3 will shortly be permitted to transmit in the band 7100-7200 kHz, if they can find a frequency that is not being used by an international broadcast station."

## **FCC Affirms \$11,000 Fine for California Amateur**

NEWINGTON, CT, Jul 14, 2004--The FCC has ordered Daniel Granda, KA6VHC, to pay an \$11,000 fine for alleged "willful and repeated" violations of the Communications Act of 1934 and Amateur Service (Part 97) rules. The Commission's July 9 Forfeiture Order followed a Notice of Apparent Liability (NAL) issued March 31. Granda did not respond to the NAL or to earlier FCC correspondence, and the FCC said it was affirming the forfeiture based on the information it had before it. "The noted violation involves Mr. Granda's failure to respond to official Commission correspondence and causing intentional interference to Amateur Radio communications," the FCC Order said. In its earlier NAL, the FCC asserted that on at least eight occasions, Granda, 58, "willfully and maliciously caused interference to other stations and conducted activity in an effort to obtain exclusive use" of a 1.25 meter repeater pair. The Whittier, California, licensee was the recipient of a December 2002 Warning Notice from the FCC Enforcement Bureau alleging that Granda deliberately interfered with two repeaters, KD6ZLZ and WA6NJJ, and requiring him to provide a detailed plan to prevent interference. Granda failed to respond to that and to subsequent notices, the FCC said. Last August, the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau set aside the grant of renewal of Granda's Amateur Extra class license, which expired last November. His renewal application has reverted to "pending" status. Granda has 30 days to pay the fine. If he fails to do so, the case could be referred to the US Department of Justice for collection.

## **Vanity Callsigns "Unlikely" in the UK Before March 2006**

For the past three years the RSGB has been in discussion with firstly the RA and more recently Ofcom over the introduction of 'vanity callsigns'. Whilst supportive of the idea, Ofcom has informed the Society that due to IT software issues it is unlikely that vanity callsigns can be introduced before March 2006.

He was on the air occasionally through the years with his FO5 callsign from his private island in French Polynesia. In an interview with Larry King on CNN recorded in 1994 and shown again this week, Brando confirmed his continued interest in amateur radio. In response to a caller's question, he said amateur radio provided him with the opportunity to "just be himself". [WIA QNEWS]

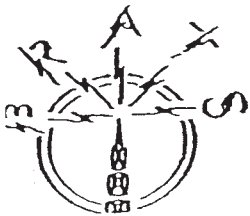
