New FCC Wireless Telecommunications Bureau Deputy Chief Appointed

FCC Wireless Telecommunications Bureau (WTB) Chief Jon Wilkins has announced his intention to appoint Suzanne Tetreault as deputy bureau chief. Tetreault is currently deputy general counsel in the Office of General Counsel.

"Suzanne's legal expertise and extensive experience as a senior leader at the FCC will make her an outstanding addition to our team," Wilkins said.

The WTB develops and executes policies and procedures for the licensing of all wireless services, ranging from Amateur Radio to mobile broadband services, overseeing nearly 2 million licenses. -- *FCC News Release via ARRL*

PROGRESS ON PARITY

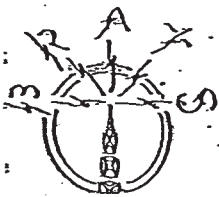
Trying to hammer out acceptable language for the Amateur Radio Parity Act hasn't been easy. But the ARRL and the organization representing homeowners associations have helped fashion an amended bill with input from congressional staffers that would permit outdoor antennas to be installed in communities with deed-restricted residential properties.

The homeowners group, called the Community Associations Institute, issued a statement expressing support for the amended language in the legislation, also known as HR 1301. And Mike Lisenco, N2YBB, the ARRL Hudson Division Director and Legislative Affairs Committee Chairman, also noted he was pleased with the agreement - but stressed that some matters still need to be worked on. Congress is expected to act on the bill sometime this year.

100 Sprite 437 MHz satellites to be deployed

A radio amateur's tiny Sprite Spacecraft are planned to be shipped to the International Space Station in July.

Nature magazine reports **Zac Manchester KD2BHC** is having a second attempt at deploying about 100 Sprite spacecraft in space.

The first attempt at deployment from the CubeSat KickSat-1 in 2014 was unsuccessful. In July KickSat-2 carrying the Sprites, each fitted with their own 437 MHz transmitter, will be flown to the ISS. The CubeSat will then be deployed later in the year and KickSat-2 will in turn deploy its cargo of Sprites.

YASME FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES GRANTS, EXCELLENCE AWARDS

STEPHEN/ANCHOR: Other gifts to amateur radio - these ones benefiting young amateurs - have been announced by the not-for-profit Yasme Foundation. Three supporting grants are being given out. The Foundation for Amateur Radio is receiving support for its 2017-2018 scholarship program; the ARRL Foundation will be helped with funds for its Yasme Foundation scholarship. A third grant will assist two young hams in Ethiopia who will participate in the Youth Contesting Program in Estonia.

The Yasme Foundation is organized to support scientific and educational projects related to Amateur Radio, including DXing and the introduction and promotion of Amateur Radio in developing countries. Supporting grants were also given to other recipients to specifically support global HF operations.

The foundation also announced three recipients of its Excellence Award, which recognizes achievement in technical, organizational or operational areas: They are longtime educator Carole Perry, WB2MGP; Tim Duffy, the ARRL's Western Pennsylvania section manager; and longtime amateur radio mentor and trainer, Tom Rauch, W8JI. 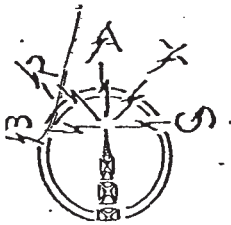
FCC Seeks Comments on Petition to Grant Lifetime Amateur Radio Licenses

The FCC is seeking comments on a *Petition for Rule Making (RM 11760)* that asks the FCC to grant lifetime Amateur Radio licenses. Mark F. Krotz, N7MK, of Mesa, Arizona, filed his request with the FCC last November. He wants the FCC to revise § 97.25 of its rules to indicate that Amateur Radio licenses are granted for the holder's lifetime, instead of for the current 10 year term. Krotz noted that the General Radiotelephone Operator License (GROL) already is issued on a lifetime basis, and he maintained that not having to renew licenses would lighten the FCC's workload.

"It would be mutually beneficial for the FCC and Amateur Radio operators to update Part 97 to grant operator licenses for lifetime, Krotz said in his filing. "The FCC would benefit by reducing administrative costs."

In 2014 the FCC granted lifetime credit for examination elements 3 and 4, but applicants seeking relicensing under that provision still must pass examination element 2.

Individuals may submit comments via the FCC's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS).

Solar indices barely changed over the past week, with average daily sunspot numbers rising from 25.3 to 33, and average daily solar flux dropping from 97 to 87.4.
Average daily planetary A index rose from 7.1 to 8.9, and average daily mid-latitude A index rose from 7 to 9.

Predicted solar flux for the near term is 80 on June 3 to 7, 85 on June 8 to 10, 80 on June 11 to 17, 85 on June 18 to 21, 80 on June 22 to 26, 75 on June 27 through July 4, and 80 on July 5 to 14.

Predicted planetary A index is 10, 35, 32, 15 and 8 on June 3 to 7, 5 on June 8 to 10, 12 on June 11 to 13, 8 on June 14 and 15, then 5, 15 and 10 on June 16 to 18, 5 on June 19 to 22, then 10, 12, 8, 20 and 12 on June 23 to 27, 5 on June 28 and 29, then 8, 15, 20 and 15 on June 30 through July 3, then 5 on July 4 to 7 and 12 on July 8 to 10 and 8 on July 11 and 12.
