## RadioShack

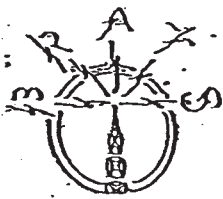
Bloomberg reports on rumours the owner of the **RadioShack** brand may file for bankruptcy in the near future. Such a move could deal another blow to the RadioShack brand, an almost-century-old source of electronics that struggled to compete with online merchants and big-box retailers. General Wireless Operations, the RadioShack successor was created in 2015 by a partnership between Sprint Corp and the defunct retailer's owners. It does business as RadioShack, operates outlets that share space with Sprint's retail locations, as well as franchising the name to other stores.

## ARLX014 King of Thailand Bhumibol Adulyadej, HS1A (SK)

Thai King Bhumibol Adulyadej (Rama IX), HS1A, died on October 13, after a long period of declining health. Born in Cambridge, Massachusetts, while his physician father was at Harvard University, the king, whose name translated as "strength of the land, incomparable power," was 88.

According to noted DXer Fred Laun, K3ZO/HS0ZAR, the king "was never very active on the air, and, to my knowledge, the only QSOs he ever made were from a handheld on 2 meter FM." He said HS1A was often "pictured using a handheld." He also was pictured with a camera, as photography was one of his passions, and he was a jazz enthusiast, who played the saxophone. The Radio Amateur Society of Thailand (RAST), the country's IARU member society, said on its website that the king was "presented the call sign HS1A by the Ministry of Communications at Chitrlada Palace" in 1989 in a ceremony witnessed by RAST officers. He was the ninth monarch of the Chakri Dynasty, having ascended to the throne in June of 1946, and was the world's longest-reigning monarch

**ARISS Congratulates Frank Bauer, KA3HDO, as Hamvention's Amateur of the Year**  
Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS) has congratulated ARISS International Chair Frank Bauer, KA3HDO, for being tapped as Hamvention® 2017 Amateur of the Year.

"Each year, Hamvention recognizes radio amateurs known for making major contributions to the art and science of amateur radio, and it's no surprise why Bauer was chosen," an ARISS statement said. Among other things, Hamvention recognized Bauer for his 1995 proposed experiment for the AMSAT Phase 3D satellite (AO-40) to measure the signal strength of the GPS satellite constellation. For years after, the aerospace industry cited this experiment, because the results helped engineers improve the GPS system, led to new applications for GPS, and changed navigation at High-Earth Orbit (HEO) and Geosynchronous Orbit (GEO) altitudes.

A radio amateur since 1974, Bauer has been the AMSAT-NA Vice President for Human Spaceflight for many years. At NASA's behest in 1996 and representing AMSAT, Bauer, with ARRL representative Rosalie White, K1STO, was instrumental in setting up the first meeting of worldwide volunteers that became ARISS.

### **Cape Cod National Seashore to Host W1MGY Titanic Memorial Special Event**

Cape Cod National Seashore in Massachusetts has invited organizers of an Amateur Radio special event in April marking the 105th anniversary of the RMS *Titanic* disaster to set up at its **Salt Pond Visitor Center**. The Titanic/Marconi Memorial Radio Association of Cape Cod — **W1MGY** — is sponsoring the worldwide commemoration to honor the approximately 1,500 passengers and crew who died when the *Titanic* — thought to be unsinkable — struck an iceberg and sank on its maiden voyage from England to the US. W1MGY operators have permission to operate from the national park for 3 days and 2 nights.

Sponsors point out that the 740 *Titanic* survivors were rescued by the *Carpathia* as a result of wireless messages sent from Marconi's **Wellfleet Station**, today preserved within Cape Cod National Seashore as its "Marconi Beach" site. Between April 13 and April 22, the national park will host commemorative events, including the special event, centering on the *Titanic* disaster and the evolution of wireless communication, culminating in the worldwide International Marconi Day. All *Titanic* events will be held at the Salt Pond Visitors Center in Eastham. Events are free and Open to the public.

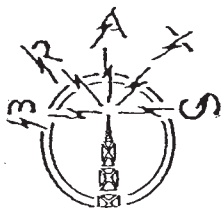

## **MARS Refocuses Its Mission, Encrypts Data Nets:**

Today's Military Auxiliary Radio System (MARS) program has changed markedly from what it was just a few years ago. So says US Army MARS Program Manager Paul English, WD8DBY, who contends that MARS must adapt in order to remain relevant and useful to its sponsor, the US Department of Defense (DOD).

"Probably the most significant changes were the Navy's decision to 'sunset' the Navy Marine Corps MARS program and our move to refocus Army and Air Force MARS on providing contingency HF Radio communications support to the DOD and the services," English said. "In order to focus our support on the Department of Defense, MARS leadership had to rethink, essentially from the ground up, what it means to be a MARS member." MARS relies on volunteers from within the Amateur Radio ranks. Among other things, recruits receive specialized training in military messaging formats and digital messaging protocols.

While the priority MARS mission is to provide contingency HF communication to support the DOD and the military, MARS also supports communication for combat commands providing humanitarian assistance and disaster relief, provides contingency communication for Defense Support to Civil Authorities (DSCA), and provides "morale and welfare communications" in support of the DOD.

This year, MARS introduced an online encryption program that allows all digital radio traffic to be encrypted as it is being transmitted. MARS has also expanded its use of automatic link establishment (ALE), although members are not required to use it.

"Our bread and butter remains single-channel HF communication," English said. "The majority of our members who do use ALE are using the MARS ALE software program. Some of our members who support our national nets are moving to hardware ALE radios."

The MARS program supports quarterly contingency communication exercises supporting the DOD. These are based on "very bad day" scenarios, where traditional forms of communication are no longer available. "Through these exercises, the DOD -- via the MARS community -- reaches out to the Amateur Radio community to provide situational awareness information at the county/local level," English said.

That makes sense to MARS member Bill Sexton, N11N, who was Army MARS public affairs officer from 2001 until 2014. "At least in theory, the blanketing omnipresence of hams across all 50 states offers a backup for blacked-out regions in the event of a catastrophic attack or natural disaster," Sexton allowed. "The challenge is mobilizing back-up operations in the total absence of internet, telephone, cell phone, or texting resources." (ARRL LETTER)
