Kay Craigie, N3KN Wins Third Term as ARRL President

The ARRL Board of Directors has elected Kay Craigie, N3KN, to a third two-year term. The Board met January 17 and 18 in the Hartford, Connecticut area for its annual meeting and the lection of officers was at the top of the agenda. The League's 15th president, Kay lives in Blacksburg, Virginia and has been in office since 2010, succeeding Joel Harrison, W5ZN. (ARRL)

FCC Opens Brief Window for Comments on WRC-2015 Draft Recommendations

The FCC has invited comments by February 18 on the latest batch of draft recommendations of its Advisory Committee for World Radiocommunication Conference 2015 (WRC-2015). At its January 27 meeting, the Advisory Committee (WAC) approved draft recommendations on a number of issues that will be considered by WRC-2015. Some items, including one which could possibly lead to changes to 60 meters in the long term, could affect the Amateur and Amateur-Satellite services. ARRL Chief Technology Officer Brennan Price, N4QX, is a member of the WAC, which is chartered to allow non-federal government entities to "provide to the [FCC] advice, technical support, and recommended proposals for the 2015 World Radiocommunication Conference."

WRC-2012 Resolution 649 invited WRC-2015, to consider allocating "an appropriate amount of spectrum, not necessarily contiguous," to the Amateur Service on a secondary basis within the band 5250 to 5450 kHz. "In order to maintain effective and reliable communications capability throughout the sunspot cycle, allocations at regular intervals are desirable, in order to permit operation as close to the maximum usable frequency as possible," the WAC said in its draft recommendations. Incumbent services in the 5250 to 5450 kHz range include fixed, mobile, and radiolocation services"A secondary allocation from 5275 to 5450 kHz avoids the unsuitable segment allocated to the Radiolocation Service, reduces the interval between HF amateur allocations below 10 MHz to permit reliable operation throughout the sunspot cycle, and maximizes the flexibility of Amateur Service stations to effectively communicate within the secondary allocation and fulfills their obligations to avoid harmful interference to primary services," the WAC concluded. NEW UK BAND PLANS PUBLISHED

The Radio Society of Great Britain has published new band plans for all United Kingdom amateur allocations from 136 kHz to 250 GHz. Copies of the band plan pages can be freely downloaded from the Operating section of the RSGB website at www.rsgb.org. RSGB membership is not required to access these files. CANADA FULLY AUTHORIZES 5 MHZ CHANNELS

Some good news for our friends to the North. On January 22nd, the Canadian regulator, Industry Canada released a decision to allow that nations ham radio community the permanent use of five spot frequencies in the 60 meter or 5 MHz band. The new grant in Canada is the result of an official Industry Canada consultation held in the Summer 2012. The frequencies designated are 5.332, 5.348, 5.358.5, 5.373 and 5.405 MHz. Canadian hams can use them on a non-interference, no-protection basis. The maximum allowable bandwidth is 2.8 kHz at 100 watts peak envelope power. CUBA GIVES HAMS ACCESS TO 60 METERS

Cuba's the Ministry of Communications of Cuba has given hamsin that island nation what amounts to strictly controlled access to the 5 MHz or 60 meter band. The rules change was approved on January 20th gives Cuban Novice class operators a power limit of 50 watts while high class license holders can run up to 100 watts maximum power out in emergency conditions as needed for a reliable link establishment. That seems to mean once any Cuban official declares any sort of a crisis situation exists that all other operations must cease immediately and the spectrum will be restricted for emergency communications only. But access to the new allocation by Cuban hams will not be immediate. According to Pavel Costa, CO7WT, as reported in the Southgate News, getting on the new allocation will require a request to the related authority and the agency's approval before hams in Cuba will be able to fire up in the new spectrum. As to whether this will be a spot frequency or continuous allocation was not mentioned in the CO7WT report. (CO7WT, Southgate, vai ARNewsline))

PORTUGUESE RADIO HAMS GET 1850 TO 2000 KHZ ACCESS

Portuguese telecommunications regulator ANACOM has granted that nations ham radio community the temporary use of the 1850 to 2000 kilohertz band. According to the announcement as posted on Portugal's national amateur radio society website this will permit Portuguese radio amateurs the ability to participate in more radiosports competitions during 2014. CELEBRATING COSMONAUT YURI GAGARIN'S 80th BIRTHDAY

On the air, keep an ear open during the entire month of March for Russian special event station UE80HS. This operation is being held to celebrate the 80th anniversary of Russia's first astronaut Yuri Gagarin who was born on March 9th 1934. Gagarin was the first human to journey into space when his Vostok spacecraft completed an orbit of the Earth on April 12th, 1961. If you work UE80HS, please QSL via RW6HS. (OPDX)

Radio Amateurs Receive Rosetta Spacecraft Signals from Deep Space

James Miller, G3RUH, was among a small handful of Amateur Radio operators to receive the X band signal January 21 from the European Space Agency's Rosettaspacecraft, some 500 million miles from Earth. Miller used the 20 meter dish at the Bochum Amateur Radio facility in Germany, run by AMSAT-DL and IUZ Bochum Observatory. In an AMSAT-BB post, Miller noted the frequency at the spacecraft was 8421.786900 MHz, and the signal was 14 dB below that of the STEREO A/B spacecraft.

Perhaps more astonishing, Bertrand Pinel, F5PL, was able to trackRosetta 65 kilometers from Toulouse using his "home-rigged" 3.5 meter dish and receiver. Viljo Allik, ES5PC, a member of Estonian Student Satellite Program team reported his group was able to detect the satellite's signal using a slightly smaller dish. "We have recently established our own small ground station for mostly educational purposes to get more interested students into space technology," Allik said in a reply to Pinel's European Space Agency blog post. The Estonian group used a 3 meter dish. Allik said the signal-to-noise ratio was in the range of 3 to 5 dB in a 1 Hz bandwidth. "So it was really exciting to see the signal from such large distance with our very simple receiving station. The elevation of the Rosetta spacecraft at our location was only about 4° during the reception."The equipment used was "a kind of amateur design," he said. "We detected signals from other spacecraft like Gaiaand STEREO A/B too, but the signal from Rosetta is the |most-distant signal we have detected so far." Launched in 2004, Rosetta will both orbit and land on a comet, which it will reach this August, and send data back to Earth. The spacecraft consists of the |Rosettaspace probe and the Philae robotic lander.

ZS60B ACHIEVES 1ST SOUTH AFRICAN 2 METER DXCC

A new record for VHF DXing from South Africa. December saw a landmark for South African VHF DXing whenPine Pienaar ZS6OB applied for the DXCC award using onlycontacts made in the two meter band. With this Pine became the first amateur in Africa and only the second in the southern hemisphere to achieve this feat. More than two thirds of two meter DXCC holders are in Europe, with their concentration of almost 70 countries in close proximity. North America features about a fifth of applicants, with about a tenth in Japan. Bob Macquarie ZL3TY was the first in Oceania and the southern hemisphere, with ZS6OB being first in Africa. South America has yet to produce its first winner. Pine used digital modes with a four-Yagi station. He has been working on his DXCC for a full decade. His single-bandaward brings the number of bands on which South Africans have earned DXCC to eleven.
