PUBLIC INVITED TO COMMENT ON FCC PROCESS REFORM


The Federal Communications Commission is inviting comment on what it terms as its Process Reform. Among the agency's goals is eliminating or streamlining outdated rules that are candidates for such action This, as a result of marketplace or technology changes that render them no longer necessary in the public interest. Interested parties may file comments on the Report and the proposed recommendations on or before March 31, 2014. All comments should reference GN Docket No. 14-25. Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the agency's Electronic Comment Filing System at apps.fcc.gov/ecfs. FCC TO PURSUE NEW NET NEUTRALITY RULES

The FCC has announced that it intends to pursue a new version of the Open Internet rules that was struck down by a judge in January. In a recent statement the agency's chairman Tom Wheeler says that he will begin taking public input on an updated set of net neutrality rules. According to Wheeler the FCC will not file an appeal in the case it lost against Verizon. Instead it plans to use the authority that the court granted in its decision to craft new regulations. Wheeler says that preserving the internet as an open platform for innovation and expression while providing certainty and predictability in the marketplace is an important responsibility to his agency. Foundation for Amateur Radio Invites Scholarship Applications

The Foundation for Amateur Radio (FAR) is accepting applications from Amateur Radio operators for scholarships for the 2014-2015 school year. The application deadline is April 15. Some scholarships give preference to radio amateurs from California, Delaware, Florida, Maryland, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia, and Wisconsin. FAR, a non-profit, all-volunteer organization, manages 52 scholarships worth a total of \$72,100. There are no age restrictions for any of the scholarships, and applicants do not have to attend a four-year institution. All applicants must be full-time students. First-Time W1AW/KG4 Guantanamo Bay Operation Set

As part of ARRL's <u>Centennial QSO Party</u>, Ed Williams, KN4KL, and Bill Verebely,W4WV, will activate W1AW/KG4 from Guantanamo Bay, Cuba in late February and early March! The operation will take place Wednesday, February 26, through Tuesday, March 4 UTC. This may mark the first time the US Navy has authorized the use of a "portable" call sign from Gitmo. QSL via ARRL Headquarters (225 Main St, Newington, CT 06111) or Logbook of The World (<u>LoTW</u>).

POLAND GIVES HAMS TWO NEW BANDS

As of February 18th, two new bands have been made available to ham radio operators in Poland. The first is 472 to 479 kHz with up to 1 Watt of Effective Radiated Power. The other spectrum is from 122.25 to 123.00 Gigahertz. Both are allocated to the Polish amateur service on a secondary non interfering basis to other services using the same spectrum. Bulgarian Amateurs get New Bands

In the future, Bulgarian amateurs have been allowed 472-479 KHz 5250 to 5450 MHz and 70.0 to 70.5 MHz. in addition, the 1.8 MHz band has been extended to 2 MHz. All of the above are on a secondary basis (GB2RS)

UK amateur hears Jade Rabbit on the Moon

Beijing's Jade Rabbit lunar rover had been thought to be dead but its radio signal on 8.4GHz was received by radio amateur Paul Marsh, M0EYT on 12 February. This is a remarkable achievement as the relatively low-power transmitter was never intended to be received by amateurs on Earth. News outlets including CNN have reported on Paul's feat. CANADIAN HAMS GET PERMINANT ACCESS TO 135HZ BAND

Industry Canada has approved permanent access by Canadian radio amateurs to the Low Frequency band from 135.7 to 137.8 kHz, subject to certain conditions put in place in late 2009. This includes a maximum emission bandwidth of only100 Hz as well as a maximum Effective Radiated Powerlevel not to exceed one watt. Also, as this is a shared allocation which Canadian hams many not cause interference to the primary users of this spectrum including stations in other nations that operate radio-navigation services. The addition of permanent access to 135.7 to 137.8 kHz is a direct result of Canada implementing changes from the 2007World Radiocommunication Conference which added amateur radio use of this spectrum on ε secondary basis. This has now been included in the newly updated Canadian RBR-4 Standards for the Operation of Stations in that nation's Amateur Radio Service. (RAC, VE3YV, VE3KI, VE3IQ)

Mellish Reef DXpedition Ready to Pick Up the Post-FT5ZM Slack

When the hubbub generated by the FT5ZM Amsterdam Island DXpedition is still echoing in our ears, the Mellish ReefVK9MT DXpedition will be waiting in the wings to launch its own adventure on the Amateur Radio airwaves. VK9MT will be handing out another rare one March 29 through April 9 from the Coral Sea atoll. "We are on schedule and will soon be on autopilot," the team announced in late January. The team said that one of its biggest logistical challenges will be the purchase of 1400 liters of "petrol" (gasoline) to fuel generators. The team has selected the 25 meter passenger expedition yacht Evone from New Zealand to transport operators and gear to Mellish Reef. Given the paucity of dry ground at the operating site, DXpedition participants plan to take their meals and sleep on the vessel. The skipper of Evohe has agreed to handle the sourcing and take delivery of the fuel. This month generators, antennas, feed lines, and accessories will be heading to Australia. Located some 1150 kilometers north-northeast of Brisbane, Australia, Mellish Reef takes the form of a boomerang-shaped platform some 10 kilometers long and 3 kilometers wide. According to the VK9MT website, the surrounding reefs, which enclose a narrow lagoon, are completely submerged or awash at high tide. Near the lagoon's center is the only permanent land — Heralds-Beacon Islet — a small cay rising just a few meters above the high-water mark and composed largely of sand, shingle and coral rubble. The schedule calls for 10 full days of operation on 160 through 10 meters, CW, SSB, and RTTY, with 10 operators. Six members of the successful ZL9HR operation from Campbell Island in December 2012 are among the team members.

WESTERN SAHARA IN MARCH

DX-World.net is reporting that 3Z9DX is planning to operate stroke S0 from the Western Sahara territory for one week only sometime in mid-March. The exact dates are yet to be determined but his activity will be on 40 through 10 meters using SSB only. QSL this one via 3Z9DX.


